THE GOD WHO SPEAKS - Year of the Word 2020: Scripture is at the centre of everything the Church does. The Word of God shapes our prayer and worship life. To mark this year, a talk by Frs. Guy de Gaynsford and Robbie Low will be given at venues across the Diocese - (Please see noticeboard for dates). The talk will look at, 'How the Church reads and understands the Bible', 'Why do we read the Old Testament: where is Christ?' and 'How the New Testament fulfils salvation history' 'Come and see how it all fits together and how we become more confident Catholics, deepened in faith and understanding and better witnesses in the world.
